From the very beginning, psychoanalytical practice and theory have focused on the structure and function of language as well as on the effects of speaking. Yet, if one takes the specific relationship of psychoanalytical theory and practice seriously, then it follows that, for psychoanalysis, there is neither a meta-theory nor a meta-language, and thus no unifying paradigm, as it has been (at least) postulated and demanded for the natural sciences. What seems to be constitutive of psychoanalytical theory and practice is rather an irreducible multilingualism, and thus an inevitable and interminable dispute over its foundations and its independence. Isn't the question about the "finite" or "infinite" analysis also the question about the 'finiteness' or 'infinity' of its theory?
